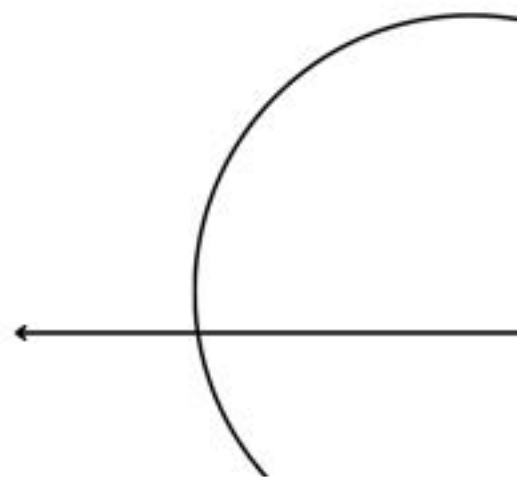

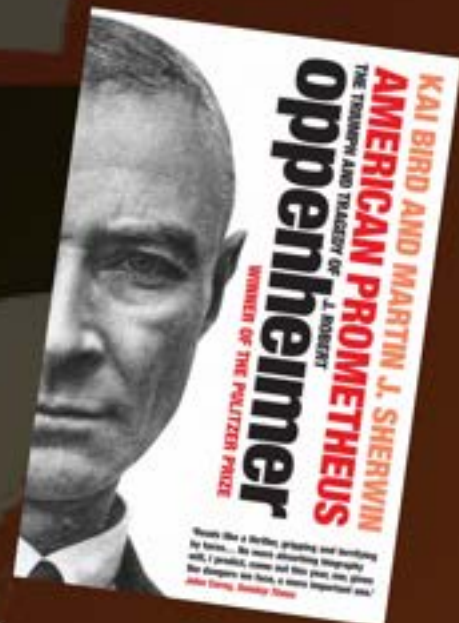

## THE REALITY OF POETIC DEVICES

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A usual day in your English class, especially in my experience of analyzing poetry, has the English department shriek for spotting poetic devices, the so-called, "literary and metaphorical tools of poets which allows them to transcend the

**S** boundaries a story could ever provide". As readers and writers of the same, we must realize that these are the essential building blocks of this art, enabling poets to craft verses that resonate with readers on profound levels. However, could these pros outweigh the not so visible drawbacks it brings?

Firstly, let us talk about the novice writers, such as us students, who may use these poetic devices in large numbers, and disregard the poem's plausibility to be a clichéd or a seemingly artificial one. This has also created a societal mindset in readers that a poem without any poetic device cannot be considered a masterpiece. The whole essence of poetry is human creativity, which poetic devices may be what they're made for, but instead do the contrary.

Secondly, if we talk about distinguished authors, who are quite an inspiration, and have such an image in front of the entire reading community, these poetic devices somehow interfere with the message or moral that the poets are trying to suggest.

For example, if we take quite a famous poem "The Road Not Taken" by Robert Frost, it was never the author's intention to make it a metaphorical symbolic poem, and instead just meant the literal sense just as the way it happened in real life. This goes to show that these poetic devices are just for a greater "show" and steal away the interpretation of the real piece of the poem.

Lastly, using devices such as hyperbole and metaphors can bring out extreme exaggerations than they are meant to be. For example, "raining cats and dogs" does not imply the literal meaning rather a metaphorical one (unless of course the poet deems it so) and sentences like "The battle between the Oliphant and Inkwell was destructive as Hiroshima" lose the true essence of the atmosphere (maybe not in this case).

All in All, as peace cannot be achieved on the road of violence, a beautiful poem cannot be achieved merely by poetic devices.
